| Since the end of the 1970s, a small, but theoretically and practical ly very active, feminist movement develops in Yugoslavia's three largest political and cultural centres (Belgrade, Zagreb and LJubljana). These feminists typically observe the society only through a gender lens, without attending to the other markers, such as, e.g. those regarding sexuality (a lesbian, a bisexual...) or ethnicity (Musim, Slovene...). The war violence on the territory of Yugoslaviawould profoundly affect the relations between the feminists. In Belgrade and Zagreb alike opposing views would appear on wheth er the purely gender lens was still applicable when discussing the victims and perpetrators of (sexual) war violence or whether their nationality should be taken into account, too.
